

DECISION OF THE COLLEGE OF THE EUROPEAN PUBLIC PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE OF 23 SEPTEMBER 2026

ON THE PROLONGATION OF THE DESIGNATION OF A EUROPEAN DELEGATED PROSECUTOR PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 16(7) OF THE EPPO REGULATION AND ASSIGNING ADDITIONAL TASKS

The College of the European Public Prosecutor's Office ('the EPPO'),

Having regard to Council Regulation (EU) 2017/1939 of 12 October 2017 implementing enhanced cooperation on the establishment of the European Public Prosecutor's Office ("the EPPO") (hereinafter referred to as "the EPPO Regulation"),¹ and in particular Articles 13(2), 16(7), 17 and 96 thereof,

Having regard to the Staff Regulations of Officials of the European Union ('Staff Regulations') and to the Conditions of employment of other servants of the European Union ('CEOS'),² and in particular to Article 123 of the CEOS,

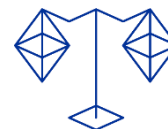
Having regard to the Decision 003/2020 of the College of the EPPO of 12 October 2020 on the Internal Rules of Procedure of the EPPO (hereinafter referred to as "the Internal Rules of Procedure"), as subsequently amended and supplemented,³ and in particular Articles 31 and 34 thereof,

Having regard to the Decision 015/2025 of the College of the EPPO of 12 February 2025 on the Conditions of employment of the European Delegated Prosecutors, and replacing and repealing Decisions 001/2020, 013/2020, 017/2021, 013/2021, 098/2021, 007/2023 and 058/2024 of the College of the EPPO (hereinafter referred to as the "CEEDP"), as amended by Decision 026/2026 of

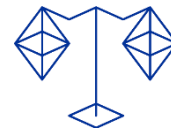
20 May 2026 of the College of the EPPO (hereinafter referred to as the "CEEDP"), and in particular Articles 20 and 21 thereof,

Having regard to the Decision 002/2021 of the College of the EPPO of 13 January 2021 on the Financial Rules applicable to the EPPO, as subsequently amended (hereinafter referred to as "the Financial Rules"),⁴ and in particular Article 78 thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) By the Decision 085/2025 of the College of the EPPO of 15 October 2025 designating a European Delegated Prosecutor pursuant to Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation, the College designated Mr Philipp ZANGERLÉ to substitute the Luxembourgish European Prosecutor, for a period of one year, starting on 1 November 2025.
- (2) By a reasoned proposal dated 7 September 2026, Mr Gabriel SEIXAS, European Prosecutor, proposed to the College:
 - a) to approve the extension until 31 October 2027 of the mandate of Mr Philipp ZANGERLÉ, European Delegated Prosecutor, to substitute the Luxembourgish European Prosecutor in case he is unable to carry out his functions or leaves his position pursuant to Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation,
 - b) to approve the assignment of additional tasks to Mr Philipp ZANGERLÉ, European Delegated Prosecutor, namely:
 - to represent, in the absence of the European Prosecutor and/or upon his instructions, the EPPO in Luxembourg for institutional and administrative matters to be discussed with the competent national authorities. These Luxembourgish authorities will mainly be: the Ministry of Justice, the General State Prosecutor and her Deputies/Attorneys, the State Prosecutors of Luxembourg and Diekirch, the Directing Investigative Judge, the Director of the Judicial Police and his Deputy, the Director and the Deputies of the Financial intelligence Unit, the Head of the Asset recovery office, the Head of the Asset management office as well as the Tax and Customs administrations.
 - the coordination of the work of the staff and the management of the premises put at the EPPO's disposal by Luxembourg, but also the regular communication with the General State Prosecutor in relation with the specific needs of the decentralised office, the coordination of relevant IT projects, and management of accesses to databases at national level. Mr Philipp ZANGERLÉ will also be in charge of the coordination of the

relations with the national media, as well as of the activities of the EPPO's local level in Luxembourg in the field of mutual legal assistance and will serve as contact point for the different Luxembourgish Ministries for any legal question or legislative issue that may have an impact on EPPO's activities in Luxembourg.

Has adopted this decision:

Article 1

Designation pursuant to Article 16(7) EPPO Regulation

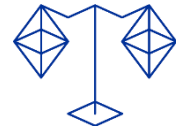
The College hereby prolongs from 1 November 2026 until 31 October 2027 the designation of Mr Philipp ZANGERLÉ, European Delegated Prosecutor in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, to substitute the Luxembourgish European Prosecutor in case he is unable to carry out his functions or leaves his position pursuant to Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation.

Article 2

Additional Tasks

The College approves the assignment of additional tasks to Mr Philipp ZANGERLÉ, European Delegated Prosecutor in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, as proposed in the above-mentioned reasoned proposal, namely:

- to represent, in the absence of the European Prosecutor and/or upon his instructions, the EPPO in Luxembourg for institutional and administrative matters to be discussed with the competent national authorities. These Luxembourgish authorities will mainly be: the Ministry of Justice, the General State Prosecutor and her Deputies/Attorneys, the State Prosecutors of Luxembourg and Diekirch, the Directing Investigative Judge, the Director of the Judicial Police and his Deputy, the Director and the Deputies of the Financial intelligence Unit, the Head of the Asset recovery office, the Head of the Asset management office as well as the Tax and Customs administrations.
- the coordination of the work of the staff and the management of the premises put at the EPPO's disposal by Luxembourg, but also the regular communication with the General State Prosecutor in relation with the specific needs of the decentralised office, the coordination of relevant IT projects, and management of accesses to databases at national level. Mr Philipp ZANGERLÉ will also be in charge of the coordination of the relations with the national media, as well as of the activities of the EPPO's local level



in Luxembourg in the field of mutual legal assistance and will serve as contact point for the different Luxembourgish Ministries for any legal question or legislative issue that may have an impact on EPPO's activities in Luxembourg.

Article 3

Entry into force

This decision shall enter into force on the date of its adoption.
