

DECISION OF THE COLLEGE OF THE EUROPEAN PUBLIC PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE OF 16 OCTOBER 2024

DESIGNATING A EUROPEAN DELEGATED PROSECUTOR PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 16(7) OF THE EPPO REGULATION

The College of the European Public Prosecutor's Office (EPPO),

Having regard to Council Regulation (EU) 2017 /1939 of 12 October 2017 implementing enhanced cooperation on the establishment of the European Public Prosecutor's Office ("EPPO") (hereinafter referred to as "the EPPO Regulation"), and in particular Articles 13(2), 16(7), 17 and 96 thereof,

Having regard to the Staff Regulations of Officials of the European Union ('Staff Regulations') and to the Conditions of employment of other servants of the European Union ('CEOS')¹, and in particular to Articles 123 of the CEOS,

Having regard to Decision 001/2020 of the College of the EPPO of 29 September 2020 laying down rules on Conditions of employment of the European Delegated Prosecutors² (hereinafter referred to as "CEEDP"), and in particular Article 14-16 thereof,

Having regard to the Internal Rules of Procedure of the EPPO³, and in particular Articles 31 and 34 thereof,

Having regard to Financial Rules applicable to the European Public Prosecutor's Office⁴ (hereinafter referred to as "the Financial Rules"), and in particular Article 78 thereof,

Having regard to the Decision 013/2021 of the College of the EPPO of 24 February 2021 laying down rules on the rights of the European Delegated Prosecutors designated to substitute the European Prosecutor of their Member State (hereinafter "the College Decision 013/2021"),

Having regard to the reasoned proposal of Mr. Gabriel SEIXAS, European Prosecutor, dated 8 October 2024, proposing to the College:

- to approve the designation for a duration of one year, from 1 November 2024 until 31 October 2025, of Mr. Philipp ZANGERLE, European Delegated Prosecutor, to substitute him in case he is unable to carry out his functions or left his position pursuant to Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation, and
- to approve the assignment of additional tasks for a duration of one year to Mr. Philipp ZANGERLE, European Delegated Prosecutor, as proposed in the above-mentioned reasoned proposal, pursuant to Article 3(2) of the College Decision 013/2021.

Has adopted the following decision:

Article 1

Designation pursuant to Article 16(7) EPPO Regulation

The College approves the designation for a duration of one year, with effect from 1 November 2024 until 31 October 2025, of Mr. Philipp ZANGERLE, European Delegated Prosecutor, to substitute the Luxembourgish European Prosecutor in case he is unable to carry out his functions or left his position pursuant to Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation.

Article 2

Additional Tasks

The College approves the assignment of additional tasks for a duration of one year to Mr. Philipp ZANGERLE, European Delegated Prosecutor, as proposed in the above-mentioned reasoned proposal, pursuant to Article 3(2) of the College Decision 013/2021.

Article 3

Entry into force

This decision shall enter into force on 16 October 2024.
